**Sten Berglund** is Professor of Political Science at the University of Orebro (Sweden) and Professor for Nordic Politics at the Humboldt University in Berlin. He is co-author of *The Political History of Eastern Europe in the 20th Century* (1997) (with F. Aarebrot), *The Handbook of Political Change in Eastern Europe* (1998) (with F. Aarebrot and T. Hellen), and *Challenges to Democracy* (2001) (with F. Aarebrot, H. Vogt and G. Karasimeonov).

**Jean Blondel** is Research Professor at the Robert Schuman Center of the European University Institute in Florence and visiting professor at the University of Siena. Among his recent publications are: *Governing New European Democracies* (2006) (with F. Müller-Rommel and D. Malova), and *Cabinets in Eastern Europe* (2001) (with F. Müller-Rommel).

**Hans-Dieter Klingemann** is professor emeritus of the Social Science Research Centre Berlin (WZB) and the Freie Universität Berlin. Currently he serves as Directeur de Recherche Associé at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques de Paris and as fellow of the Centre for the Study of Democracy, University of California, Irvine, USA. His publications include: *A New Handbook of Political Science* (1998) (with R. Goodin), and *Citizens and the State* (1998) (with D. Fuchs).

**Paul Lewis** is Reader in Central and East European Politics at the Open University (GB). His many publications include: *Central Europe since 1945* (1994), *Party Structure and Organization in East-Central Europe* (1996), and *Political Parties in Post-Communist Eastern Europe* (2000).

**Darina Malova** is Professor of Politics at Comenius University, Bratislava. Her recent publications include *Governing New European Democracies* (2006) (with J. Blondel and F. Müller-Rommel).

**Zdenka Mansfeldova** is Deputy Director, Institute of Sociology, Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic, Department of Sociology of Politics. Among her publications are *Post Communist Party Systems* (1999) (with H. Kitschelt et al.), *Central European Parliaments* (2004) (with D. Olson and P. Rakusanova), and *Patterns of Europeanization in Central and Eastern Europe* (2005).

**Wolfgang Merkel** is Director of the Science Centre and Professor for Comparative Politics at the Humboldt University in Berlin. His recent publications include: *Consolidated or Defective Democracy? Problems of Regime Change* (2004) (with A. Croissant).

**Ferdinand Müller-Rommel** is Professor of Comparative Politics and Director of the Center for the Study of Democracy, University of Lüneburg (Germany). His publications include *Cabinets in Eastern Europe* (2001) (with J. Blondel), *Political Parties in the New Europe* (2002) (with Richard Luther), and *Governing New European Democracies* (2006) (with J. Blondel and D. Malova).

**Vello Pettai** is Professor of Comparative Politics at the University of Tartu (Estonia). His recent book publications include *The Road to the European Union* (2003) (with J. Zielonka) and *Deciding on Europe* (2005) (with P. Ehin).
