

RADICAL DESIRES AND DECOLONIAL CRITIQUE

About 50 years ago, the mass-protest of gays and lesbians against discrimination was at once an assertion of a new collective consciousness, while also creating a radical new subjectivity and a collective sense of identity. They fought for social and legal equality while at the same time refused to be co-opted by bourgeois society as just another civil rights movement.

Politics were supposed to be wild, playful, and subjective; experiences and desires were put in the foreground of collective action – aiming at the interconnection between subjective, bodily experiences, radical avant-garde theory and emancipatory politics. Starting with the unboundedness of (sexual) desire they sought to transgress schemes of binarity and wanted to transform society as a whole. They shared this goal with many other struggles for liberation of the 1960's and 70's. A special inspiration came from the anticolonial movements.

In France, the Algerian War of Liberation, which ended in 1962 also informed the fight of homosexuals. This produced very problematic but also productive ambivalences and contradictions.

In this workshop, we want to investigate how politics and desire were theorized in the radical homosexual movement in France, especially by the Front Homosexual d'Action Révolutionnaire (FHAR) and his main figures, such as Monique Wittig and Guy Hocquenghem.

In different formats, we want to go beyond mere historicization of these ambivalences and explore which problems of the present appear in a different light through them, and which aspects could be linked to today's problems.

SPEAKERS

LUKAS BETZLER and HAUKE BRANDING are the editors of the German edition of Guy Hocquenghem's "Le desir homosexuel" and a dossier on Soziopolis which is dedicated to Hocquenghem's work and theory. They also published several essays on Hocquenghem.

SIDO LANSARI is a multidisciplinary artist born and raised in Casablanca, Morocco. His artistic practice revolves around questions related to identity, gender and sexualities by exploring the blind spots of memory, from the point of view of linguistic, artisanal or archival heritage. His film "Les Derniers paradis" (F 2019, 14 min, French with English subtitles) tells the almost-true story of Sami. In Casablanca, he only dreams about dancing and Egyptian divas in the hairdressing salon where he works. Until the day he meets Daniel, a lover who helps him discover Paris in the midst of a gay revolution.

ÉMILIE NOTÉRIS is a text worker, born in 1978. She has widely written on and translated anarchist and feminist theory and literature. Her most recent publication is "Wittig" (Les Pérégrines, October 2022) a draft for a biography of Monique Wittig.

TODD SHEPARD is Arthur O. Lovejoy Professor at the Department of History at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, USA. His scholarship explores how imperialism and transnational developments shaped late-twentieth-century Europe and especially France.
