

Institut für Sozialarbeit und Sozialpädagogik Information on Bachelor's Thesis

The Bachelor's Thesis will usually be written during the sixth semester. The seminars of the module "8000: Bachelor's Thesis" serve as a support format for all students to conceptualize their Bachelor Thesis.

It is important to reflect that the Bachelor's Thesis is not solely a completed module, but also represents the thesis that you complete your degree program with. Therefore, please focus on a specific topic that you are really interested in and that you have possibly been interested in during a longer part of your studies. In the Bachelor's Thesis, you will get the opportunity to investigate this topic more carefully than before.

To have your Bachelor's Thesis supervised and graded, you are going to need two supervisors.

Please contact your preferred chief supervisor early enough (ideally at the end of the 5th semester), and – what is most important – conceptually prepared. Ideally, you write down your first idea concerning the topic(s) of your Bachelor's Thesis on approximately 1 page. This paper might contain a first idea on your research question.
