Programme Outline: The Master's programme in Sustainable Development approaches sustainability issues from an interdisciplinary perspective and comprises 120 ECTS credits corresponding to a period of study of at least four semesters or two years. At least 60 ECTS credits have to be earned at the chosen entrance university. The mobility semester can be spent at any of the consortium partners including the mobility partners Basel University (Switzerland) and Hiroshima University (Japan). An additional mobility semester can be spent at the partner universities TERI (India) and Stellenbosch (South Africa)
