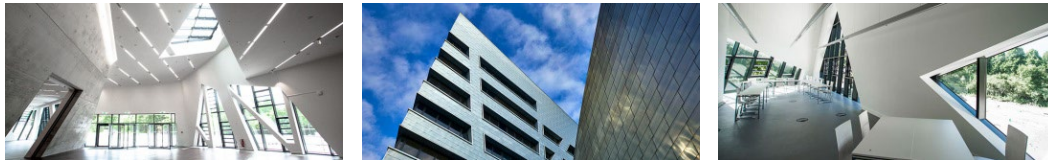


18. Workshop on Microeconomics – Call for Papers
