Documents to be submitted with the online application (German or English language):

- Certificate of enrolment of the home university
- Transcript of records
- Learning Agreement (Proposed study plan for study abroad)
- Certificate of Bachelor/Master degree (if applicable)
- Copy of passport or ID
- Data Protection Declaration for students regarding the use of data processing systems (form can be downloaded with online application)
- Proof of language proficiency

Language requirements

Incoming exchange students must have at least one of the following language proficiency:

- Intermediate level (B1) in German when taking courses taught in German (official test certificate, e.g. Telc B1, Goethe-Zertifikat B1, TestDaF TDN 3 with 13 points, DTZ B1, onSET certificate B1)
- Upper intermediate level (B2) in English when taking courses taught in English (official test certificate, e.g. TOEIC 4 Skills with a minimum of 850 points, IELTS 6.5 Test, Cambridge Advanced Certificate with Grade C or higher, TOEFL with a minimum of 90 points)



PRE-ARRANGEMENTS

Visa

Citizens of

- EU countries and EFTA countries do not need a visa. They can register with the local authorities upon arrival.
- Australia, Canada, Japan, Israel, South Korea, New Zealand, United Kingdom, and the United States can enter Germany without a visa and must apply for a residence permit upon arrival.
- Non-EU countries who hold a valid residence permit from another EU member state may study in Germany for up to 360 days without a visa. The European Directive [EU2016/801](#), the so-called REST Directive, must be observed here. The residence permit of the other EU member state must be valid for at least the entire duration of stay in Germany.
- Other countries are advised to contact the German embassy or the nearest German consulate.

Arrival services

New international students will be provided individual assistance upon arrival. Volunteer students, so-called 'buddys', will help students from abroad to settle in and make them feel at home in Lüneburg. Buddys pick up new students at either the airport or the train station, take them to their place of stay and provide support to cope with daily life matters. Health insurance

- Health insurance covering full medical care during the study abroad in Germany is obligatory. Travel insurance is not accepted.
- For enrolment at university, there is an electronic registration procedure in Germany that can only be carried out between German health insurance companies and the universities. This is the reason you have to contact a German health insurance company, which will then register you with Leuphana.

STUDIES

Course information

All programs of study at Leuphana University have been modularized in order to support international student mobility and to allow credit transfer. A module is defined as a unit that comprises a set of courses on a given topic including a final exam.

Exchange students register at Leuphana University in the same study program just like at their home university and in accordance with our cooperation agreement. For their module selection, they have access to all fields of study and are allowed to take up to 50% modules from other subject areas according to their study level (bachelor/master).

The module selection will be finalized within two weeks prior to the start of lectures by attending a mandatory module selection navigation program (information and selected single events with online access), additionally an optional consultation is offered with the academic advisor at Leuphana University. However, this does not guarantee a place in a specific module/course, since places in some study programs (e.g. Psychology, Digital Media) are limited. Priority is given to students majoring in their field according to the partner universities cooperation agreement.

Semester workload

The standard semester workload comprises 30 ECTS credits.

A standard module at Leuphana University comprises 5 ECTS credits.

Orientation days and intensive German language course

The International Center offers orientation days, which include assistance with all formal requirements (registration with the university and local authorities, health insurance, etc.), introduction to the services and facilities provided by Leuphana University, a guided Lüneburg tour, a day trip to Hamburg, social events, and a 3-day trip to Berlin (only in April).

In addition, the International Center offers a 3-week German intensive language course (available from beginner level) for new international students before lecture period starts.

Language support during the semester

Leuphana University offers German language courses at all levels during the semester.

The Writing Center helps students to prepare coursework/presentations, write an essay, etc. both in German and in English.

Generally, almost everybody in Germany understands and speaks English.

Campus facilities

IT and Media Center -- WIFI on campus -- University library with printers -- Canteen and cafeteria -- Sports facilities and gym -- Music practice rooms -- Bicycle rental and repair -- Room of silence (a place of rest, contemplation and prayer)

Sustainability

Leuphana University is pursuing the path of sustainability in research, education, cooperation and campus operations. For Leuphana University, sustainability is a principle that is practised in all areas of the University.

For the sustainable development of campus operations, Leuphana University is EMAS (Eco-Management and Audit Scheme) certified, has been climate neutral since 2014, and has been awarded the label Fairtrade University.

At the Faculty of Sustainability, researchers focus on global challenges and their solutions. It offers study programs with a focus on sustainability. A large number of students initiatives are involved in various topics for their sustainable campus: urban gardening, sustainable music festival, social, sustainable business, no waste, etc.

Disability

The University campus is widely accessible for people with disabilities. A limited number of apartments for disabled students is available.

Travel

The International Center organizes a couple of weekend trips during the semester, e.g. to Bremen or to the seaside, in winter to Christmas Markets like in Lübeck. In addition, students can easily go by train from Lüneburg or by plane from Hamburg to destinations in Europe.

Internship / Volunteer opportunities

There are jobs and volunteer opportunities on and off campus. Leuphana Career Service provides assistance in applying for an internship upon completion of the study abroad.
