Furthermore, the leisure opportunities in small towns and villages are rather limited and student life depends on them these days. But many students have problems financing their studies in the expensive cities in Germany, and there is certain anonymity at large universities, which is something new for everyone since it was different at school.

If we now relocate the universities/colleges to small towns/villages or if we now build small universities in many "small" places, offer housing options and thus enable study life to be reduced to a schoolyard feeling. In this way, we would support the small towns financially, and certain modernity and diversity could also be integrated into these places. For the older people in our society who mostly live in the countryside and are dependent on doctors etc., we could offer an environment nearby where they can get to the doctor, go shopping or get to social events in a short distance.

So our concept aims to relocate the universities/colleges to the countryside in many small forms. In this way, we offer the students a feeling of familiarity and community without overcrowded rooms, expensive apartments, or great anonymity. We relieve the cities and allow the villages and small towns to integrate more into society and break away from the typical stereotypes. Of course, such a visionary and large project entails a



lot of change and problems and can hardly be implemented in our society. However, we take on the idea with a progressive, visionary, and imaginative view to envision a new, more modern, or alternative way of studying.
