Another result of that challenge is the lack of access to art that denies a broader understanding of art from different traditions, cultures and individuals. That leads to the society missing out on cultural exchange and inspiration as an artist as well as a consumer of art. The gatekeepers who provide the access to art have a restricted view on the understanding of art which is why completely different forms of art and perspectives don't get the opportunity to be seen. Already in institutions like schools artwork of children gets judged which leads to pressure among the children and makes them assimilating to the existing artistic standards through which individuality already gets lost in childhood. Isn't it a paradox that art stands for freedom of expression and on the other hand gets restricted? How can we as a society address these challenges?

We see an opportunity in early artistic education for everyone. Access to art has to be granted through organizing artsy events representing multiple cultural backgrounds. Another option would be to grant free art or music classes, so everybody has the opportunity to gain some skills. To take these approaches to the next level the system with gatekeepers would have to be revolutionized.
