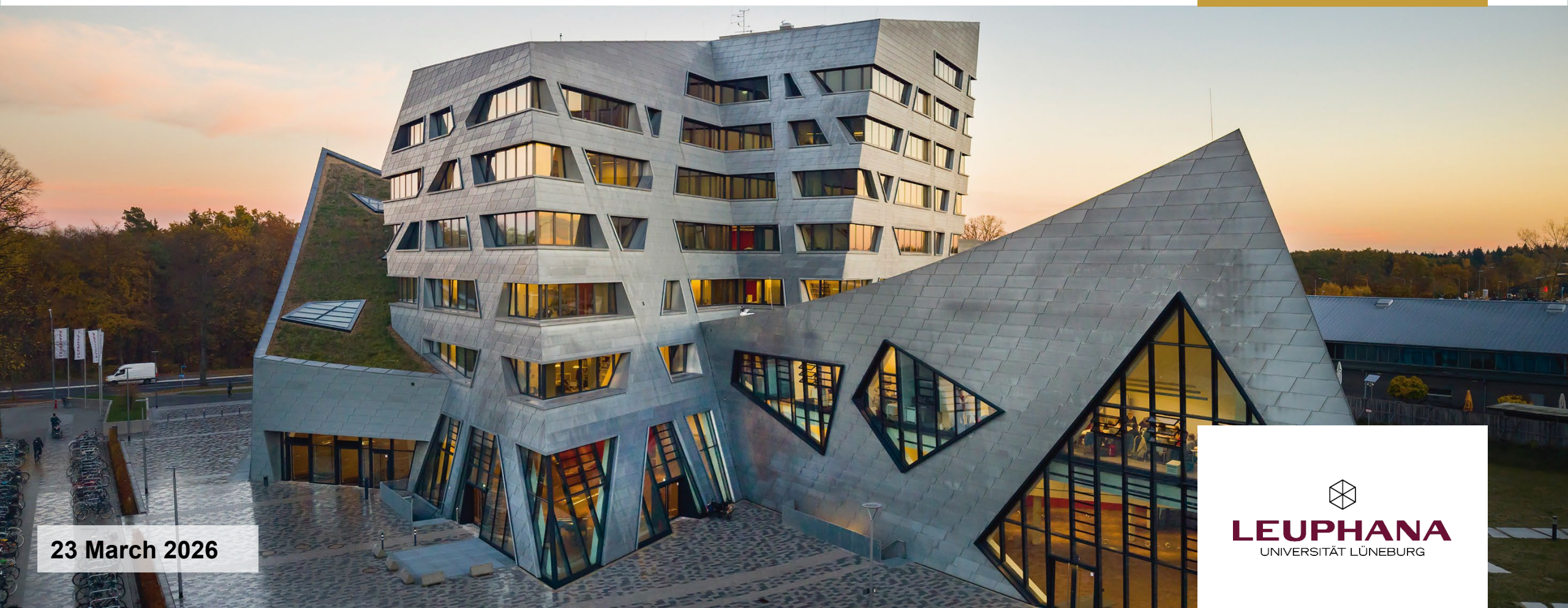

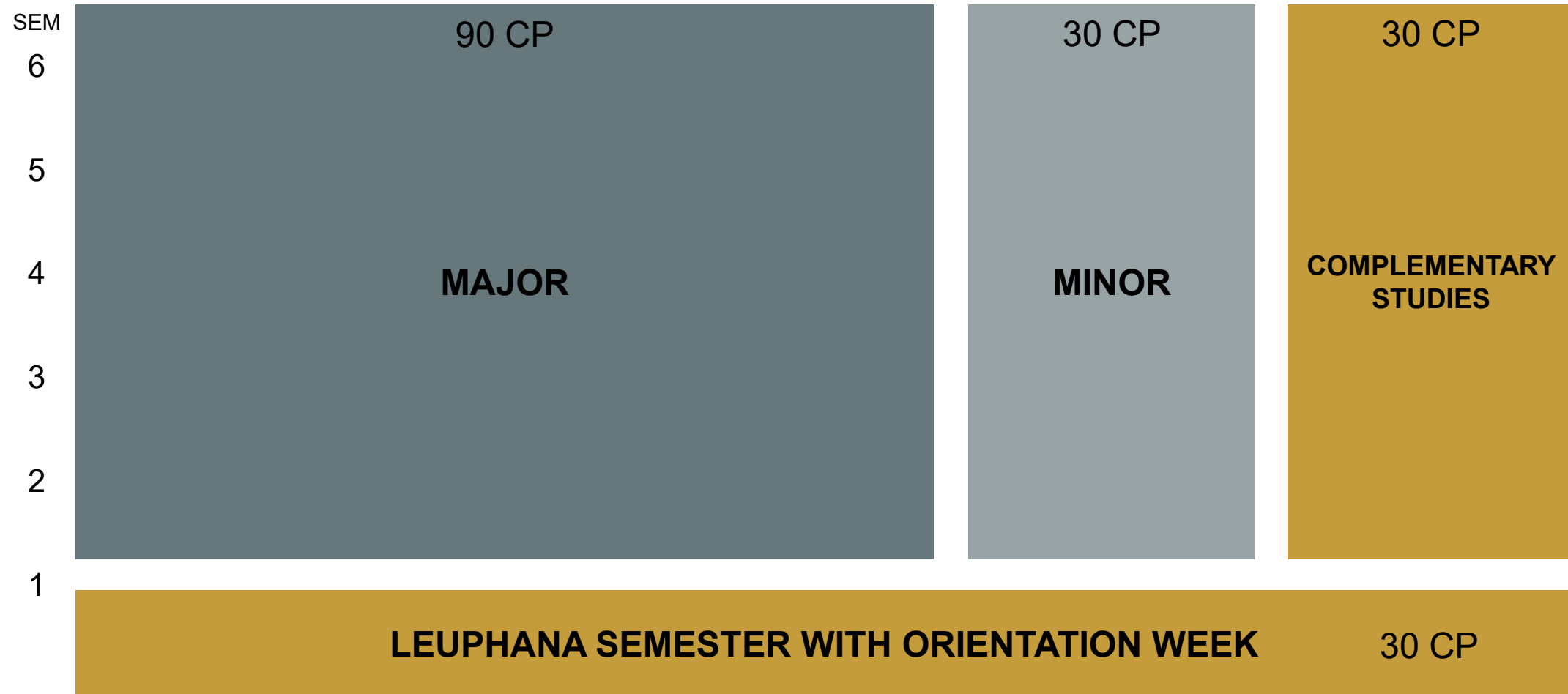

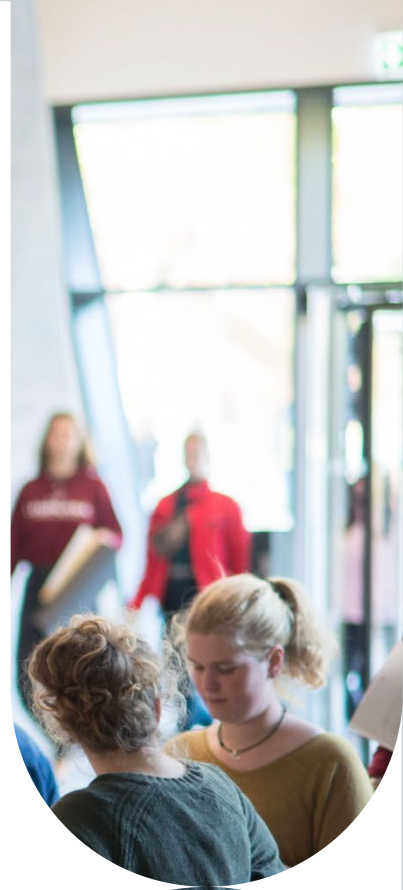

COMPLEMENTARY STUDIES

3. ENROLMENT RULES

- Complementary courses can be taken **from the 2nd semester onwards**
- **Leuphana Bachelor's** students must earn **a total of 30 CP** (different rules apply to study programmes with a teaching option)
- You will receive **5 CP** for each successfully completed course
- **PLEASE NOTE: Up to three modules can be completed per semester.** Any special features regarding study planning can be found in the respective **subject-specific appendices for the major.** In these documents, "ideally" **does NOT** mean "**must**"!

- **Each module** must be successfully completed once
- Each module may be **repeated once** to earn additional credits (additional achievements).

- Additional courses are possible as long as not all required modules have been completed.



Course titles are used as assessment titles.

Content In this module functions with multiple variables, multivariate optimization, optimization under constraints, matrices, vector algebra and linear programming are treated. Basic subject-specific methodological knowledge is acquired.

Professional competence Building on the contents of Mathematics I for Economics, participants acquire the methodological foundations of analysis and linear algebra required for theoretical and empirical economic applications.

Personal competence Participants learn to present, evaluate and argue for basic concepts and procedures of analysis and linear algebra in a comprehensible way.

Teaching and learning formats The module consists of a lecture (2 SWS) and an exercise class (1 SWS). The lecture conveys the material - preparation and revision of the material using the provided literature is expected (self-study). The exercise class assists students with specific questions that deepen the content of the lecture.

Withdrawal usually possible up to 3 business days before the exam date
(There are exceptions for combined academic works).



IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING EXAMS

- Automatic registration for the second exam date:
 - if you fail
 - if you do not show up
- In case of failed attempt: Review your exam, make an informed decision!
- Withdraw **by 3 business days** before the exam date
- **One** fourth attempt is possible upon special request
- Loss of enrollment status after 3 or 4 failed attempts
