	AN OVERVIEW OF THE FIRST SEMESTER	
	Opening Week 1st & 2nd and 5th – 10th October 2026	During Opening Week, you'll gain a comprehensive insight into studying at Leuphana, get to know your fellow students and work together on your first project.
	Course registration 2 October (8.00 am) – 23 October (11.59 pm) 2026	Using myStudy, you can put together your timetable by selecting the seminars and lectures you wish to take in the coming semester.
	Prize Draws 1st draw: 6 October (11.00 pm) 2026 2nd draw: 9 October (12.00 noon) 2026	If demand for a seminar exceeds the number of places available, places will be allocated by lottery. If you do not secure a place on your first choice, you can apply again for any remaining places in a second lottery or move up the waiting list within the first two weeks.
	Term 12 October 2026 – 31 March 2027	Your seminars and lectures take place during the term. There are no lectures over the festive period from 24 December 2026 to 6 January 2027.
	Registration period for examinations 12 October – 26 October 2026	To sit an exam, you must register via myCampus; you can also withdraw your registration there within the specified deadlines. Registering for a module in myStudy does not replace exam registration.
	Exam periods 8–27 February 2027 22 March–3 April 2027	During the two examination periods, you will complete your modules with written examinations and assignments. You will complete your examination work and submit it by the specified deadlines.
	Conference week 10–12 March 2027	Conference week is the highlight of the Leuphana semester: you'll present your project results, engage in discussions with other students and celebrate the end of the semester together.
