GVBI. p. 167), the Senate of Leuphana University of Lüneburg adopted the following first amendment to the On February 21, 2024, the Senate of Leuphana University of Lüneburg adopted the following first amendment to the General Regulations of Leuphana University of Lüneburg for admission to all Bachelor's degree programs with which the requirements for a teaching profession are taught (2-subject Bachelor), dated 19. April 2023 (Leuphana Gazette No. 44/23 dated May 15, 2023) . The Executive Board of Leuphana University of Lüneburg approved this change on February 21, 2024.

The General Regulations of Leuphana University of Lüneburg for admission to all Bachelor's degree programs that provide the prerequisites for a teaching degree (2-subject Bachelor's degree) are amended as follows:

- 1. In § 2 para. 3 sentence 1, "Business Education" is deleted and the sentence reads as follows: "¹The application must relate to access and admission to two teaching subjects ("Teaching and Learning" Bachelor's degree course) or one teaching subject and one vocational subject ("Social Pedagogy" Bachelor's degree course). ²Similarly, enrolment for all Bachelor's degree programs that provide the prerequisites for a teaching profession is for two teaching subjects (Bachelor's degree program in Teaching and Learning) or one teaching subject and one vocational subject (Bachelor's degree program in Social Pedagogy)."

 - (3) "1 To participate, you must register for the selection interview by the deadline. 2An application for a study place is required for registration and participation in the selection interview. 3Otherwise, registration and participation are possible regardless of the regulation in § 3 para. 3 no. 2 and 3, however, the consideration of the result of the selection interview for the selection decision according to § 10 is subject to the reservation of § 3 para. 3.3 If several dates are offered for the selection interview, only one date may be attended. Applicants who do not participate will continue to be included in the ranking list and may receive a study place in the further main, succession and lottery procedure on the basis of their ranking (§ 10).
 - (4) When registering for the selection interview, applicants can indicate that the selection interview should be conducted via video conference."

of the first amendment of February 21, 2024 (Leuphana Gazette No. 75/24 of March 22, 2024)
 known.

§ 1 Scope of application

These regulations govern admission to the first semester in all partial Bachelor's degree programs (subjects) that provide the prerequisites for a teaching degree (2-subject Bachelor), insofar as they are designated as admission-restricted in the respective admission regulations of the Ministry of Science and Culture.

§ 2 Application deadline and form

- (1) ¹The application for the first or a higher semester in the winter semester of a year must be submitted by July 15 (cut-off deadline) of a year. ² In deviation from sentence 1, an application for the higher semester is also possible for the summer semester of a year and must be submitted by January 15 (cut-off deadline) of a year.
- (2) ¹The application procedure takes place in electronic form. ²Applicants must register in the Campus Management System provided by Leuphana University of Lüneburg. ³By registering, applicants undertake to use the Campus Management System provided by Leuphana University of Lüneburg and to check the associated mailbox regularly. ⁴Once registration has been completed, the applicant can apply for admission to a degree program using the electronic application form provided by Leuphana University of Lüneburg for this purpose. ⁵Applicants who demonstrate to Leuphana University of Lüneburg within the respective application deadline that they cannot reasonably be expected to apply and submit their application in electronic form will be supported by Leuphana University of Lüneburg. ⁶These applicants can visit the Leuphana University of Lüneburg Student Services in person and will be supported in their application by Leuphana University of Lüneburg staff.
- (3) ¹The application must relate to access and admission to two teaching subjects ("Teaching and Learning" Bachelor's degree course) or one teaching subject and one vocational subject ("Social Pedagogy" Bachelor's degree course). ²Similarly, enrolment for all Bachelor's degree programs that provide the prerequisites for a teaching profession is for two teaching subjects (Bachelor's degree program "Teaching and Learning") or one teaching subject and one professional specialization (Bachelor's degree program "Social Pedagogy").

(4) ¹Leuphana University of Lüneburg determines the documents to be attached to the electronic application for admission. ²The relevant documents must be uploaded to the Campus Management System in pdf format by the deadline. ³Applications that are not complete and received in due form and time will be excluded from the admission procedure.

§ 3 Admission procedure

- (1) ¹For the admission of foreign nationals and stateless persons with a recognized foreign educational background who are not equivalent to Germans according to § 1 para. 2 sentence 3 NHZVO (foreigner quota), the selection decision is made in the following procedure based on the following criteria:
 - 1. The average grade of the university entrance qualification is converted into points according to the table in Appendix 1 and a ranking list is drawn up.
 - 2. ^{1 By} voluntarily taking the TestAS study aptitude test in German, applicants can achieve additional points in accordance with Annex 3 and thus improve their position in the ranking list. ²The TestAS core module must be selected according to the sub-degree program for which the application is made in accordance with Annex 3.
 - 3. In addition, the special circumstances listed in Annex 3 pursuant to Section 5 (4) NHZG are taken into account.

²The points achieved from sentence 1, points 1 to 3 are added together to calculate a total score. ^{30n the} basis of the score calculated in this way (max. 43 points), an overall ranking list is drawn up among all applicants in the foreign quota. ^{4ln the event of} equal ranking, § 5 para. 9 NHZG applies. ⁵The selection decision is made by the Executive Board. ⁶Admission notifications are issued electronically for the unsuccessful applicants and made available for retrieval in the protected area of the Campus Management System in accordance with Section 2 (2). ⁷Applicants will be informed by email of any changes to their application status. ^{8 A} succession procedure or lottery procedure takes place.

- (2) ¹After deduction of the preliminary and special quotas in accordance with § 22 Para. 1 NHZVO, 90% of the available study places for a partial degree program are allocated according to the results of the university's own selection procedure. ²The remaining 10% are allocated according to waiting time. ³The waiting period will not exceed seven semesters.
- (3) Participates in the admission procedure.
 - 1. who has applied for a study place in due form and time according to § 2,
 - 2. fulfills the admission requirements and
 - 3. does not participate in the award procedure as part of a preliminary or special quota pursuant to Section 22 (1) (1), (3) or (4) NHZVO (quota for foreign students, second degree quota, quota for professionally qualified students).

§ 4 University selection procedure

- (1) As part of the university's own selection procedure (Section 5 (7) NHZG), the selection decision is made in two successive stages in accordance with paragraphs 2 and 3.
- (2) 1 In the first instance, 30 percent of the study places are allocated among all applicants according to the result of

their average HZB grade (Section 5 (7) sentence 1 no. 1 NHZG). ²Appendix 1 applies for determining the ranking. ^{3In the} event ^{of} equal ranking, Section 5 (9) NHZG applies. ^{4The} selection decision is made by the Presidential Board. ⁵The selected applicants receive a letter of admission. ⁶This notification will be issued electronically and made available for retrieval in the personal basic account of the applicant concerned in accordance with Section 2 (2). ⁷Applicants will be informed by email about a change of status in the Campus Management System. 8With the letter of admission, applicants are given a deadline by which they must confirm acceptance of the study place electronically via their personal basic account in accordance with § 2 para. 2. ^{9If} this declaration ^{is} not submitted in due time and form, the letter of admission becomes invalid. 10The legal consequence must be pointed ^{out} in the notification. ^{11 There is} no succession or lottery procedure.

(3) ^{1In} all other respects, the selection decision is based on the eligibility criteria set out in §§ 5 to 8 (§ 5 para. 7 sentence 1 no. 2 NHZG). ²The HZB average grade is of considerable importance here.

§ 5 HZB average grade

With the HZB average grade, applicants can achieve a maximum of 30 points in the selection procedure in accordance with Annex 1.

§ 6 Extracurricular achievements relevant to studies

Applicants can achieve a maximum of 5 points in the selection procedure with extracurricular achievements relevant to their studies in accordance with Annex 2, whereby points are only awarded once in each category.

§ 7 Study aptitude test

- (1) Applicants are required to complete a supervised written test of their academic aptitude, with which they can achieve a maximum of 24 points in the selection process.
- (2) The study aptitude test is conducted in German.

§ 7a Mathematics knowledge test

- (1) ¹All applicants for mathematics as a teaching subject who have applied for the Bachelor's degree program in Teaching and Learning can take the mathematics subject knowledge test. ²There is no separate invitation. ³Applicants who wish to take the Mathematics Subject Knowledge Test must register online in advance.
- ¹A maximum of 24 points can be achieved in the Mathematics Subject Knowledge Test. ²Applicants who solve less than 30% of the tasks in the Mathematics Subject Knowledge Test correctly will not be awarded any points.
- (3) For all applicants for the subject of mathematics who have applied for the Bachelor's degree program in Teaching and Learning and have taken part in the mathematics test, the arithmetic mean is calculated from the results of the study aptitude test according to § 7 (maximum 24 points) and the mathematics subject knowledge test (maximum 24 points). Applicants who have not taken part in the Mathematics Subject Knowledge Test will not be awarded any points for this; the result according to § 7 therefore remains unchanged.

§ 8 Selection interview

- (1) A pre-structured selection interview is conducted for the applicants, in which they can achieve a maximum of 24 points in the selection process.
- ^{1The aim} of the selection interviews is to determine aptitude for the Bachelor's degree programs that provide the prerequisites for a teaching profession by considering the motivation, goals and expectations of the applicants. ²The selection interviews are conducted by interviewers appointed by the selection committee (§ 11). 3The interviewers appointed receive extensive written and oral preparation for their work. ^{4The guideline} for the duration of an interview is 20 minutes. ^{5The} selection committee shall develop an interview guide in advance for the interviews, which the respective interview leaders must follow. ⁶Standardized minutes must be kept of the main content of the interviews. ⁷The selection interview will be conducted in German.
- (3) ¹To participate, you must register for the selection interview by the deadline. ²An application for a study place is required for registration and participation in the selection interview. ³Otherwise, registration and participation are possible regardless of the provision in § 3 para. 3 no. 2 and 3, however, the consideration of the result of the selection interview for the selection decision according to § 10 is subject to the reservation of § 3 para. 3.³ If several dates are offered for the selection interview, only one date may be attended.⁴ Applicants who do not participate will continue to be included in the ranking list and may be awarded a place in the further main, succession and lottery procedure on the basis of their ranking (§ 10).
- (4) When registering for the selection interview, applicants can indicate that the selection interview should be conducted via video conference.

§ 9 Recognition of aptitude test, selection interview and mathematics subject knowledge test

¹The results of the aptitude test, selection interview and mathematics knowledge test from the previous year's selection procedure can be taken into account if the applicant

- 1. has completed the aptitude test, the selection interview or the mathematics knowledge test in the previous year for the same study program and in the same language,
- 2. has applied for the results from the previous year to be taken into account during the usual electronic registration for the aptitude test, the selection interview or the mathematics subject knowledge test via a web platform provided by Leuphana University of Lüneburg.

²The application according to sentence 1 no. 2 can be submitted for all or only one of the aptitude criteria. ³In the case of an application, renewed participation in the aptitude test, the selection interview or the mathematics subject knowledge test is excluded. ⁴Subsequent applications are also excluded.

§ 10 Selection decision / admission according to the university's own selection procedure

- (1) ¹The points from the average HZB grade and achieved in the allocation of study places in accordance with Section 4 Para. 3 and the extracurricular achievements relevant to the course in accordance with Sections 5 and 6 are added together. ²The points achieved from the study aptitude test pursuant to § 7 in the case of mathematics as a subject, taking into account the mathematics subject knowledge test pursuant to § 7a para. 3 are weighted with 0.4 and from the selection interview pursuant to § 8 are weighted with 0.6 and added together. ³If only the study aptitude test according to § 7 is offered for a degree program, the test result is included unchanged in the total. ⁴A total score is calculated from the partial sums from §§ 5 and 6 as well as §§ 7 (if applicable in conjunction with § 7a) and 8. ⁵On the basis of the score calculated in this way (max. 59 points), an overall ranking list is drawn up among all applicants. ^{6In the event of} equal ranking, Section 5 (9) NHZG applies.
- ¹Admission to a degree program can be granted immediately after the cut-off period in accordance with Section 2 (1) if all applicants are admitted to the degree program. ²The decision is made by the Presidential Board.

§ 11 Selection committee

- (1) A selection committee is appointed by the Presidential Board to prepare the selection decision for admission to the first semester.
- (2) 1tt consists of one member of the Executive Board or a person appointed by the Executive Board as chairperson, two professors, two research assistants and two students. 2In addition, a sufficient number of deputies are appointed. 3The faculty councils or for the student members the responsible study commissions can nominate members and deputies from the faculties that conduct selection interviews. 4The term of office of the members and deputies is three years, that of the student representatives one year. 5Reappointment is possible.
- (3) 1The selection committee is responsible, among other things, for the detailed organization of the selection interviews (content and design of the interview guidelines) and the appointment of the interview leaders, at least half of whom should be members of the university. 2 It may consult other persons who are particularly experienced in the various sub-degree programs in an advisory capacity.
- 4) ¹The selection committee may exceptionally decide, based on the available number of applicants after expiry of the exclusion period in accordance with § 2 para. 1, not to continue the university's own selection procedure in accordance with § 4 para. 2 for Bachelor's degree programs with which the requirements for a teaching profession are imparted if it is foreseeable that a sufficient number of applicants will not be available. ²§ Section 10 para. 3 applies accordingly.
- (5) The selection committee reports to the Senate on the experience gained after completion of the award procedure and makes proposals for the further development of the procedure.

§ 12 Admission outside the study place allocation procedure

¹Applications for admission to studies outside of the study place allocation procedure must be submitted in writing to the university (Student Services) by March 15 (cut-off deadline for the summer semester) and by September 15 (cut-off deadline for the winter semester) in accordance with Section 4 (5) NHZG. ²The application must relate to 2 teaching subjects or one teaching subject and one vocational subject. ³A copy of the university entrance qualification certificate (HZB) and any supplementary applications must be attached to the application.

§ 13 Admission for higher semesters

- (1) ¹The available study places in a higher admission-restricted semester are allocated to applicants in the following order,
 - a) for whom a refusal of admission for personal reasons would mean particular hardship,
 - b) in the same or a comparable degree program

- aa) are already enrolled in a partial degree program at Leuphana University of Lüneburg,
- bb) are or were enrolled at another German university, a university in another member state of the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area,
- cc) are or have been enrolled at a foreign higher education institution that does not fall under letter bb with German citizenship or equivalent to German citizens under admission law,
- dd) have been admitted for the first semester and can be placed in a higher semester.
- c) who assert other reasons.

²The reasons stated in sentence 1 must be proven. Applicants must prove that they have the level of performance required for the course in the higher semester. ⁴Proof in accordance with sentences 2 and 3 must be submitted together with the application in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 (4) by the deadline. ⁵Admission requires placement in a corresponding semester by the responsible examination board.

- (2) Within each of the three case groups in paragraph 1, admission shall be determined by the social, in particular family and economic reasons relevant to the choice of location, then by the result of the higher education entrance qualification and finally by lot.
- ¹The selection decision is made by the Executive Board. ²The selected applicants will receive a letter of admission, the unsuccessful applicants will receive a letter of rejection. ³The respective notifications are issued electronically and made available for retrieval in the personal basic account of the applicant concerned in accordance with § 2 para. ² Applicants will be informed by email about a change of status in the Campus Management System. ⁵In the letter of admission, applicants are given a deadline by which they must declare their acceptance of the study place electronically via their personal basic account in accordance with § 2 para. ² If this declaration is not submitted in due time and form, the letter of admission becomes invalid. ⁷This legal consequence must be pointed out in the letter of admission. ⁸A succession procedure or a lottery procedure in accordance with § 37 NHZVO takes place. ⁹In justified exceptional cases, the letter of admission or the letter of rejection may be issued in writing. ¹⁰In the event that the letter of admission was issued in writing, acceptance of the study place can also be declared in writing.

§ 14 Processing of personal data

- (1) ¹The following categories of personal data of applicants are processed for the purpose of carrying out the admission and admission procedure and, if applicable, subsequently for enrollment:

 - 5. University entrance qualification (HZB): type, country, district, city, result (grade point average), date,
 - 6. Information on universities already attended,
 - 7. Information on practical training,

The specific feature of the Bachelor's degree, which provides the prerequisites for the teaching profession, is its polyvalence: the degree enables students to continue with subject-specific Master's programs in educational science programs or Master's programs in the chosen teaching subjects as well as the corresponding Master's degree in teaching and, in principle, to start a career outside the teaching profession. Accordingly, the study model with two teaching subjects, interdisciplinary professionalization area and Leuphana semester as well as (to a lesser extent) the Leuphana complementary studies and the Bachelor's degree is specifically aimed at this polyvalent education.

Against the background of this study concept, the extracurricular achievements listed in the table are particularly important for the success of the study program and thus an expression of the suitability of the applicants for the polyvalent study program with interdisciplinary components in the sense of the idea of liberal education in the Bachelor Teaching and Learning and the subsequent diversely qualifying job profile in the sense of polyvalence.
