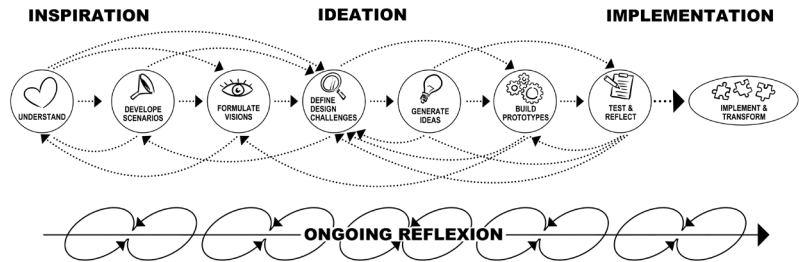

You don't discuss things to death, you do. You are here to build a functioning prototype, to develop a plan of action and to experience the Design Thinking Process. And not to forget: to have a great time.

The 13th Responsible Management Education Research Conference is centered around the topic **Reclaim, Resist, Reimagine: Sustainability and the Future of Responsible Management Education**

The Design Jam is an innovative, highly participatory method that provides an opportunity for international students from various fields of study and universities to collaboratively identify new possibilities.

You ...

- explore future scenarios based on future research and foresight
- derive specific challenges from a desired future
- co-create ideas and prototype concepts
- pitch your idea at the RMERC 2026 opening
- get experts feed-back on your ideas
- experience a Design Thinking process
- gather extra-curricular experience

Moreover, you probably find topics e.g. for your master thesis, (future) work projects, or voluntary engagement.

What happens at
the Global Goals
Design Jam?

After a short introduction, you will work with a set of trend cards, exploring and discussion scenarios for how businesses might operate in the Future.

You then derive specific challenges from the desired future. After team-building you will co-create solutions: ideas, concepts and initial prototypes, which you will test and later **present in the opening plenary of the RMERC Conference.**

Note: Ideas don't have to be implemented afterwards, but they might: at your university, in your company, or somewhere else.
