

BEING ABLE TO ACT IN THE EVENT OF CONFLICT: STRATEGIES FOR CONFLICT RESOLUTION IN COOPERATION

Target group: Doctoral candidates, postdocs, junior professors and newly appointed professors

Format: Classroom event

Language: German

Conflicts are part of everyday life in academia – sometimes we find ourselves in the middle of them or sense that our counterpart is involved.

This workshop focuses on consciously perceiving your own situation in the event of a conflict and reflecting on your feelings, communication and behaviour. Addressing conflicts is often an exciting moment – that's why we practise preparing challenging conversations and developing options for action in a group setting. The aim is to classify conflicts and act in a self-caring manner. The workshop fills your 'toolbox' with the right tools for the next steps: conversation techniques, distance, inner peace or external support.

- Classifying types of conflict and their dynamics
- Taking a meta-level view: reflecting on your own conflict behaviour
- Understanding emotions and projections and acting appropriately to the situation
- Preparing for and conducting conflict discussions

Digital visibility has become essential for researchers in order to disseminate their own research, network and participate in professional and social dialogue. With a researcher profile on social media, a personal 'brand' can be created, in the context of which desired career options can also be established. At the same time, engagement on social media harbours uncertainties or even risks. How much time should be expected to be spent on it? What constitutes good communication logic? What undesirable paths might one's own activities take and what should be done in such cases? The event will discuss the following topics in detail:

- Why is digital science communication important for researchers? Benefits & significance for public image and career options
- Getting to know the various digital channels (focus on LinkedIn, in short: X, Mastodon, Bluesky, Instagram, YouTube, TikTok)
- A good online profile (focus on LinkedIn)
- Identifying and utilising communication opportunities
- Social media posts: explaining your own research in an understandable way
- Interactive exercises: visibility check of digitally successful scientists on LinkedIn (group work in breakout rooms); writing a LinkedIn post and feedback from peers and trainer.

INTERVIEW TRAINING IN FRONT OF THE CAMERA

Target group: professors

In the age of mass media, scientists are increasingly required to be able to present their findings in understandable sentences in a media-friendly manner. At the same time, scientists want to be able to present themselves in a convincing, clear and credible manner: good media skills generate attention and prestige, prove useful for fundraising and research projects, and attract talented doctoral students and postdocs.

Participants in the training learn how to present themselves and their research concisely and comprehensibly in various communication situations (in front of a running camera, microphone, in personal conversations, etc.). In particular, they learn what they should keep in mind when dealing with journalists. Participants put what they have learned into practice during the training and receive video files of their performance.
