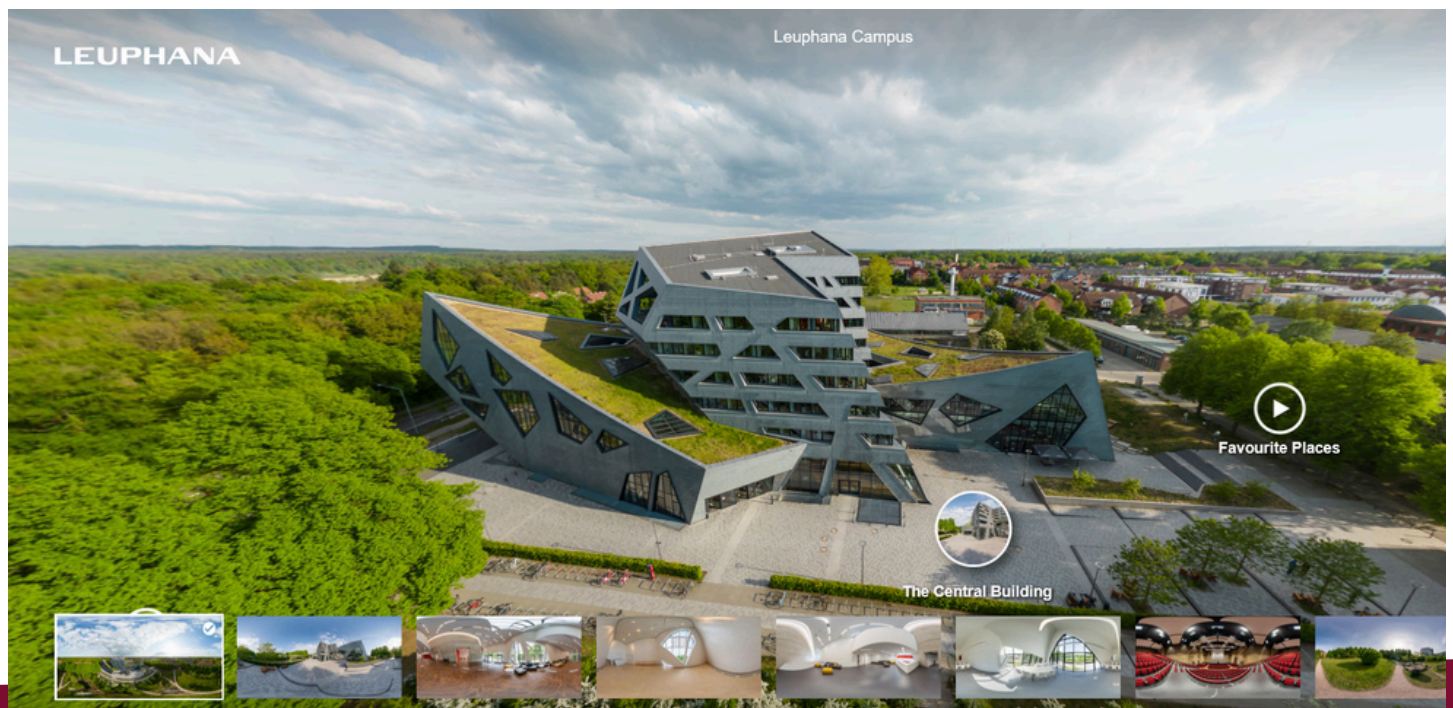

Leuphana's co-working spaces provide flexible, modern environments where students collaborate on projects, work independently, and exchange ideas across disciplines.

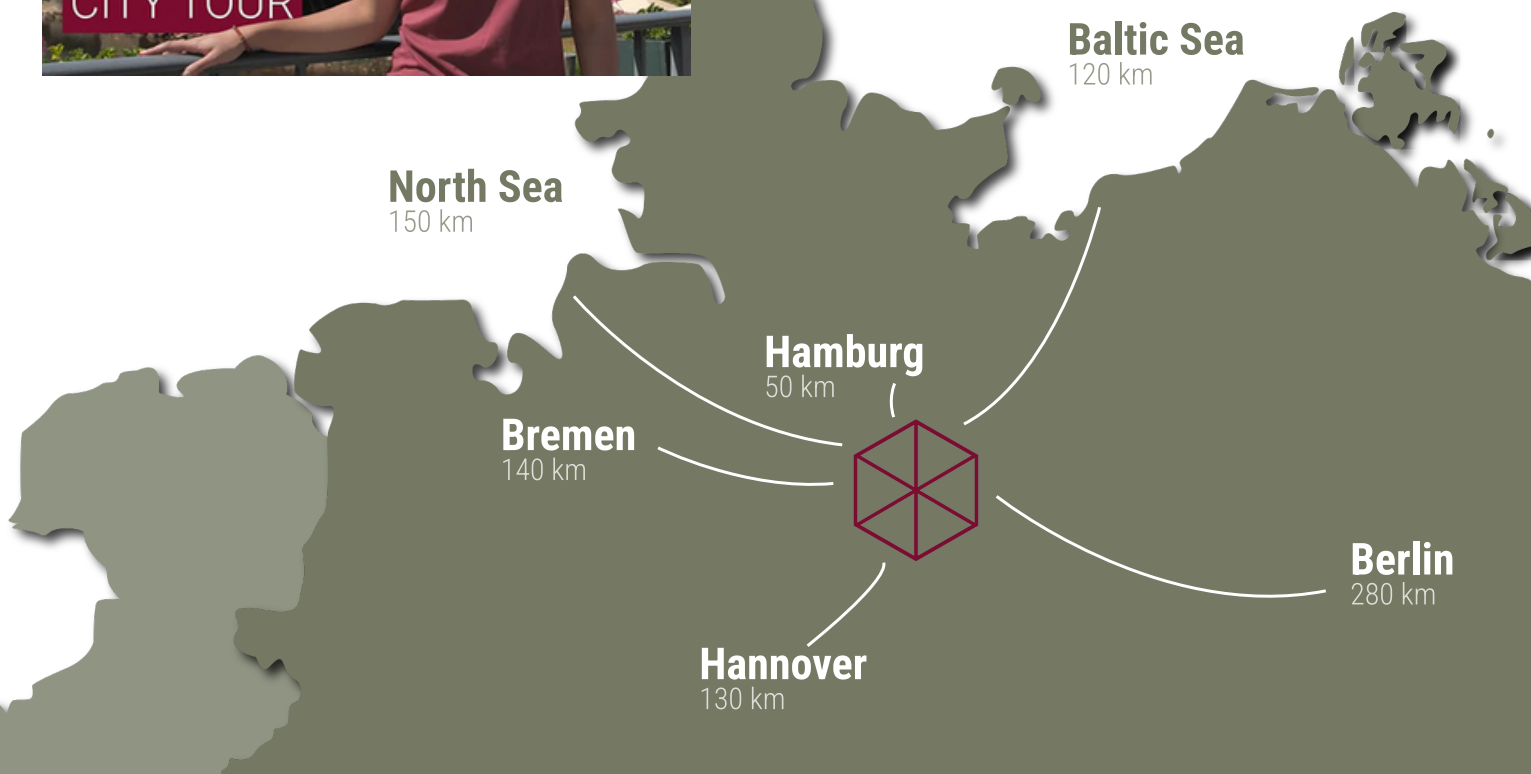

GENERAL COSTS (per month)

- Rent: 350–500 €
- Food (if you eat at the dining hall): 200–230 €
- Health insurance: approx. 120–130 €
- Books, clothing, leisure activities, miscellaneous: 80–250 €

Total: 750–1.110 €

SEMESTER CONTRIBUTION (per semester)

- Student Union fee: 138 €
- Student body contribution: 239,94 € (Deutschland semester ticket, culture ticket, StadtRad etc.)
- Contribution to administrative costs: 75 €

Total: 452,94 €
