FLEXIBILITY THROUGH F-I FARNING

This programme is structured in such a way that lectures primarily take place via the e-learning platform allowing students to benefit from extensive supervision and scientifically sound tutorials. The content is conveyed ideally via varied webinars, case studies, project work in small groups and practice-based guest lectures.

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The Masters course of study encompasses a total of 60 credit points. In the winter semester, students will deal with the principles of competition and procedural law, particularly with interdisciplinary interactions of law and economics. In the summer semester, the focus is on regulation law and its application in European and international contexts. Furthermore, an interdisciplinary module will allow students to extend their personal competences in seminars on management and responsibility.

10 INTERNATIONAL AND INTERDISCIPLINARY

The combination of an internationally-oriented and interdisciplinary course of study including law and economics conveys legal competences far beyond a purely technical level. With this English-based degree and professional training, students will be able to work on multinational cases in competition and regulation law.

NEW PROFESSIONAL OPTIONS

Competition law and regulation law are complex and socially-relevant sectors which require specific legal examination. Proof of appropriate expertise opens up new professional options in the national and international work market. As a graduate of the Masters programme Competition & Regulation, you can request admission as the specialized lawyer for procurement law.

ONLINE-BASED DEGREE

With its e-learning elements, students can combine the degree ideally with their professional and personal obligations. They can work full-time and obtain a degree in just three semesters, without losing earnings. Due to the programme coordination and e-tutoring, students will be supervised consistently and suitably throughout the whole degree.

PROFESSIONAL NETWORK

In the scope of the lectures, students will meet lawyers from renowned major law firms who work in the area of competition and regulation law. They will benefit from an exclusive network of experts who work in this lucrative field. At the same time, students will also meet practitioners from authorities, such as the Federal Cartel Office or the Federal Network Agency.

INTERNATIONALLY-RECOGNISED DEGREE

The Competition & Regulation LL.M. from the Leuphana University of Lüneburg is an internationally-recognised degree, accredited by the FIBAA (Foundation for International Business Administration Accreditation).



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YOUR PATH TO THE COMPETITION & REGULATION LL.M.

The programme starts off twice a year. Applications for the April intake are due on December 10^{th} and applications for the October intake are due on May 31^{th} .

WHAT PREREQUISITES ARE REQUIRED?

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The Masters programme is designed for prospective students with professional experience who want to gain a further qualification in national and international competition and regulation law.

Applicants to the Competition & Regulation LL.M. will have:

- A first professionally-qualifying legal or economic law university degree in which relevant legal knowledge was gained. Other degrees in relevant subjects may also be recognised.
- Relevant professional experience of at least one year.
- Proof of good English skills (e.g. 92 points in the online TOEFL test or comparable scores from other tests).

HOW MUCH DOES THE COURSE COST?

The fees amount to 9,700 EUR in total, divided across three semesters, plus around c. 210 EUR (current value) in semester fees. Costs relating to the degree can be offset against taxes on the basis of current applicable regulations.
