## INTERSECTIONALITY DURING COVID-19: APPROACHES AND LESSONS

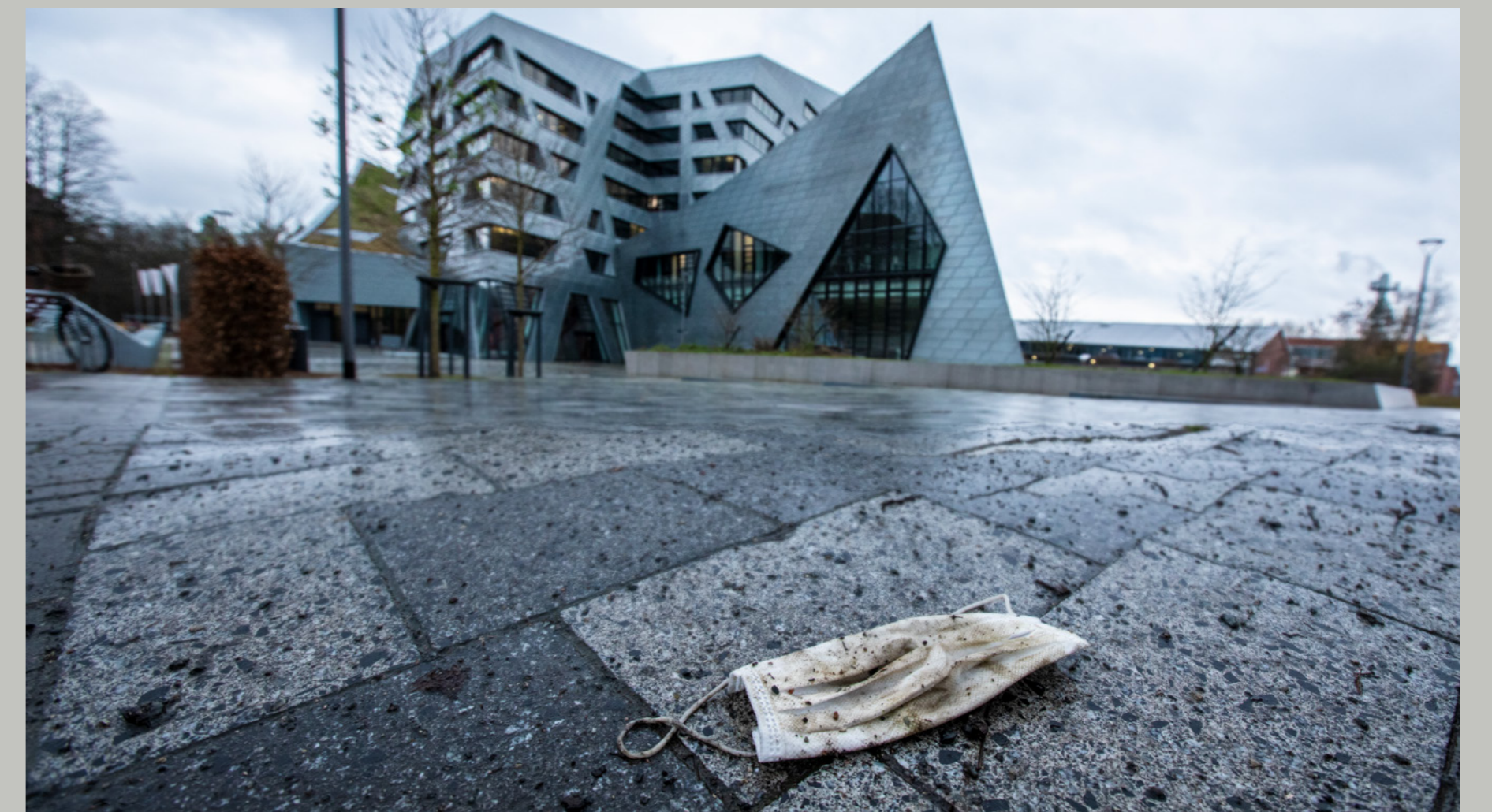
