NOTES ON SURVEY

Objectives of this evaluation

- Group opinion for assessing the teaching-learning process based on various aspects
- Comparison of the lecturers' and students' perspective
- Reflection, dialogue and suggestions for a successful achievement of the teaching-learning objectives

Data collection and analysis

- Answering scales: generally 7-point monopolar scales (strongly disagree ... rather disagree / rather agree ... strongly agree) or bipolar scales (for example, too low ... reasonable ... too high)
- Statistical analysis based on parameters (amongst others mean value and standard deviation) and distribution diagrams
- Two different reference values, if available: university & faculty / school / institution (in this case: Arbeitseinheit Sportwissenschaft)






OVERALL LEARNING AND TEACHING SUCCESS






TRANSPARENCY OF COURSE OBJECTIVES & MEDIATION AND STIMULATION






RESPECT VERSUS DISCRIMINATION






LECTURER CONTRIBUTION






COURSE STRUCTURE & INTERACTION AND INCLUSION
