
The Cascade Model of Academic Text Production – Phases and Actions (Knorr 2018)

Goal Manage one's own writing actions in a productive way using reflection.

Prerequisite People who are able to identify their position in the process (phase and point in time) can purposefully choose the action that is necessary for the completion of the next subtask in the writing project.

Theory

Academic text production entails multiple phases which overlap. The length of said phases varies, they do however end in the sequence specified below. The discovery (or initial) phase can, for example, continue until the revision phase nears its end. This phase cannot continue past that point. Reading, writing and talking are basic actions of academic text production, which serve different purposes. For instance, new knowledge can be generated through writing. The texts that are written for knowledge acquisition are, however, usually NOT part of the text that is handed in.
